CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Schaub called the meeting of the Eatonville Town Council to order at 7:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

- a. Public Works Reports- Complete written reports are on file with the Town Clerk.
- **Police Report** Chief Witt reported that he is working with Chief Yount to address at-risk youth at Eatonville Middle School, that he is organizing a Safe Streets Campaign in Eatonville on November 4th and gave background information on Resolution 2016-W.
- c. Fire Report- Assistant Chief Yount announced that Fire Department participated in the Homecoming festivities of the High School and that it is awesome to be in Town. He also announced that the new Chief had evening commitments prior to being hired by SPFR, is currently unable to attend Council meetings, and that Eatonville's Darley Apparatus is currently being repaired and it will be back in Eatonville when the repairs are done.
- d. Public Safety Committee- Councilmember Gribi announced that the Public Safety Committee meeting met on November 1st and discussed the completion of the LEMAP Study, will be working on Emergency Management on ICS training for employees, citizen emergency management, and discussed the timeline for annexation with South Pierce Fire and Rescue.
