

**EATONVILLE TOWN COUNCIL  
MINUTES OF REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING**

**TIME:** 7:00 PM

**DATE:** July 11, 2016

**PLACE:** Eatonville Community Center

**CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Pro-Tem Gribi called the meeting of the Eatonville Town Council to order at 7:00 p.m.

**ROLL CALL**

Town Clerk Kathy Linnemeyer called the roll. The following were:

Present: Councilmembers James Schrimpsheer, Bob Walter, Bob Thomas and Jennie Hannah.

Also Present: Town Clerk Kathy Linnemeyer, Assistant Fire Chief Sam Yount and Police Chief Brian Witt.

**OPENING CEREMONIES**

Mayor Pro-Tem Gribi led the assembly in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

The Town Clerk read the Mission Statement for the Town of Eatonville:

“The Town’s mission is to create, provide and administer municipal services while protecting the present and future health, safety, and general welfare of the community.”

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA/SET TIME RESTRICTIONS**

Councilmember **Schrimpsheer** moved approval with a three minute time restriction and was seconded by Councilmember **Hannah**. All were in favor.

**COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS**

Citizen Jim Bieker thanked the Mayor and Council for bringing the Net Metering Ordinance forward and stated that his solar panels have been installed and inspected.

Councilmember **Walter** moved approval and was seconded by Councilmember **Schrimpsheer**. All were in favor.

#### **DEPARTMENT HEAD/COUNCIL COMMITTEE/BOARD/COMMISSION REPORT**

- a. **Police Report-** Chief Witt reported that the increase in minor property crime is still occurring and that the Police Department made an arrest on Friday. The investigation is continuing. Chief Witt also reported that the Department is continuing to prepare for the LEMAP Study.
- b. **Fire Report-** Chief Yount reported that South Pierce Fire and Rescue is working to replace Chief Vellias, the call responses to District 23 have decreased and we will have to submit a Resolution to Pierce County by August 2<sup>nd</sup> as a backup in case the EMS Levy is rejected by the voters in August.
- c. **Parks/Cemetery Committee-** Councilmember **Walter** announced that the Parks/Cemetery Committee met on June 28<sup>th</sup> and discussed repairing the fence between Glacier Park and the Cemetery, alternate locations for a Dog Park and holes in the surface of one of the ramps at the Skate Park. Councilmember Walter stated that he called the company who installed the park, and was told that this kind of damage is usually caused by bikes or blade scooters using the facility. He also stated that the Committee feels that we should make the repairs as soon as possible and close the ramp until repairs are made. Councilmember **Schrimpsheer** stated that the Council needs to consider money for 24 hour security cameras as part of the 2017 budget.
- d. **Public Safety Committee-** Councilmember **Gribi** reported that the Public Safety Committee met on July 5<sup>th</sup>. The Committee discussed the July 4<sup>th</sup> parade road closures and are looking at ways to improve traffic impacts for next year, reviewed the Attorney's response to whether firearms can be banned from the Community Center and are waiting for additional information.
- e. **Mayor Report-** Mayor Pro-Tem Abby Gribi announced that the July 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> festivities went well and it is estimated that there were more than 5,000 people in attendance, the Town is working towards an Electrical Apprentice program that will go before the Washington State Apprenticeship Committee for approval on July 21<sup>st</sup>, the Town has hired a temporary seasonal employee who will be working in the Parks Department and we will be bringing the 6 Year Street Plan back before Council to review at a Study Session before our next meeting on July 25<sup>th</sup>.

#### **ORDINANCE 2016-2 Second Reading**

An Ordinance of the Town of Eatonville, Washington, amending Eatonville Municipal Code section 10.16.015 relating to parking.

Town Clerk Kathy Linnemeyer read the Ordinance by title into the record.

Councilmember **Walter** made a motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance 2016-2 and was seconded by Councilmember **Hannah**. The motion passed with Councilmember **Thomas** voting no.

### **ORDINANCE 2016-11 Second Reading**

An Ordinance of the Town of Eatonville, Washington, amending the Eatonville Municipal code by adopting a new chapter 13.34 “Electric Net Metering.”

Town Clerk Kathy Linnemeyer read the Ordinance by title into the record.

Councilmember **Walter** made a motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance 2016-11 and was seconded by Councilmember **Schrimpsheer**. All were in favor.

### **ORDINANCE 2016-12 Second Reading**

An Ordinance of the Town of Eatonville, Washington, amending the Eatonville Municipal Code by adopting a new chapter 13.36 “Renewable Energy Cost Recovery Incentive Program.”

Town Clerk Kathy Linnemeyer read the Ordinance by title into the record.

Councilmember **Walter** made a motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance 2016-12 and was seconded by Councilmember **Schrimpsheer**. All were in favor.

### **ORDINANCE 2016-13 First Reading**

An Ordinance of the Town of Eatonville, Washington, approving a site specific rezone for parcels 3605002300, 3605002310, 3605002322, and 3605002280 located at 303 and 305 Center Street West and Pennsylvania Avenue South and amending the Eatonville Zoning Map by changing the zoning classification for the property from Multi-Family Residential District, High Density (MF-2) to Downtown Commercial district (C-1)

Town Clerk Kathy Linnemeyer read the Ordinance by title into the record.

Councilmember **Schrimpsheer** made a motion to approve Ordinance 2016-13 on the first reading. There was no second on the motion and Councilmember **Schrimpsheer** withdrew the motion.

Councilmember **Schrimpsheer** made a motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance 2016-13 and was seconded by Councilmember **Walter**. The motion passed with Councilmember **Thomas** voting no.

### **COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS**

Councilmember **Gribi** informed everyone that there will be a Pump Track demo at Mill Pond Park on July 29<sup>th</sup> and encouraged everyone to attend. A Pump Track could be a future possibility for bikes.
