Recent Events

Officer's McGuire and Anderson took part in the town's Christmas parade on December 1st. South Pierce Fire and Rescue Chaplain Dorothy had eight C.E.R.T. team members assist us with traffic control. Their help was instrumental in making it a safe and enjoyable event. Officer McGuire handled the planning and communications for the parade as he has done with all of the previous parades during my tenure. His organizational skills are incredible.

Training

In 2018, all EPD Officers have completed at least 24 hours of mandatory training. One officer had 44 hours and the remainder attended 52 to 60 hours of Firearms, Defensive Tactics, Legal Updates, First Aid, Active Shooter, and Emergency Vehicle Operations.

Management Activities

Officer Gill has submitted his letter of resignation effective January 24, 2019. We will have to reassemble the civil service commission and reinstate our contract (with Council's approval) with the National Testing Network. We will be open to new recruits as well as experienced applicants. I would like to wish Officer Gill success as he continues his career with Redmond Police Department. In the meantime, our department will take a significant hit as far as staffing levels are concerned. We are examining our schedule to find an option that will benefit the Town.

Significant Cases/Issues

Officer Anderson was able to use the new surveillance system at the Bud Blancher trailhead to solve a car prowler and arrest a career criminal. Water Superintendent Steve Mckasson assisted our officers in mining and recording the footage.
