I would like to thank The Town Public works crew for an outstanding job during our recent snow/ice event. ### **Training**

I will be scheduling E.P.D. officers for 60 hours of training in 2019. This training includes, active shooter, summer and winter firearms qualifications, defensive tactics, emergency vehicle operations, and first aid/legal updates. All of the training is provided by Pierce County at no cost.

I would like to thank the council for their reconsideration of using National Testing Network for our hiring process. I understand the logic in conducting our own test but feel it is best to have it sourced out.

## Significant Cases/Issues

An Eatonville resident had two rounds fired through his house on 1/27. Both rounds were fired from a long distance away and were on a downward trajectory. Both bullets were fired from a high-powered rifle and still had enough energy to be lethal. We have located the area just outside of town where the shots came from and recovered evidence from the scene. Our investigation is still ongoing.
