APRIL 2019 REPORT

General

My official start date as chief of police was April 8, 2019. Due to a pre-planned vacation, my first active day as chief was April 10. I want to thank Interim Police Chief Frank Clark for effectively running the department until I was able to fill the position.

Public Safety Committee

I attended the Public Safety meeting on April 7, where we discussed the code and roadway revisions for Rainier Avenue, Erin Lane and Weyerhaeuser Road.

I proposed acquiring ballistic helmets from the Pierce County Sheriff's Department's surplus inventory. The helmets would provide better protection for our officers in the event of an active shooter or other high-risk event. This surplus acquisition would suffice until new helmets with a higher protection level could be purchased. Councilman Bill Dunn favored the suggestion of eventually purchasing new helmets with a higher protection rating.

I also proposed purchasing heavy tactical vests that would be used during incidents involving high powered rifles because standard body armor would not provide adequate protection.

Management Activities

The selection process to fill the police officer position vacancy is underway. Candidates are in the background investigation process, which is facilitated by the National Testing Center. Initially there was a delay due to a staffing issue and the background investigator's availability. I contacted one of the investigators and requested the process be expedited. I was advised they would do their best to accommodate my request. One of the top candidates withdrew his name after a couple of ride-alongs because he determined that a career in law enforcement was "not for him."

I met with the team (officers and Gaille Finley) as a group and laid out my expectations. We also had an open discussion, where I listened to their concerns, requests and comments. I am excited to have a great team and I look forward to working with, mentoring, and leading each of them.

I will be meeting with each officer individually over the next few weeks to further discuss topics from our team meeting and listen to what they feel is working, what we can improve on, and their wishes for training and equipment. I will be assessing their knowledge, skills and abilities in an effort to support their strengths and assist them in overcoming any weaknesses.

I will have a team meeting every other Thursday, which will begin with a personal positive anecdote/accolade for each officer, followed by team business, and ending with a training topic.

The Town hosted a "Meet the Chief" community gathering on April 22, where I was able to meet and greet approximately five citizens (in addition to a gentleman from Miami who was passing through town) and more than a dozen town employees and administrators. I would like to thank Abbi Gribi and Kathy Linnemeyer for organizing the event.

My first town council meeting was later that evening. I was told that the attendance rate was much higher than normal (approximately 25) and I was able to meet and talk with everyone.

I submitted my social media plan to Mayor Schaub, which he approved. Heather Songer, the public information officer for the Washington State Gambling Commission, will be volunteering to assist with getting our social media up and running. I am optimistic this will be an efficient and effective way to strengthen the relationship between EPD officers and the residents of Eatonville.

Preparations for National Night Out are underway with assistance from Abby Gribi and Kathy Linnemeyer. The Pierce County Sheriff's Department's SWAT Team and K9 Unit have committed to providing officers, vehicles and equipment for this event.
