## **SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE**

---

- As of July 4<sup>th</sup>, I have started to schedule myself to do 24hr shifts on random days throughout the month. This is above and beyond my contract, but I feel that it is important to spend time with the firefighters and respond on calls with the different shifts and stations. This also gives me the ability to interact with citizens all over the district and provide oversight and command functions on emergency scenes.
- SPFR are happy to announce that three firefighters from our volunteer program are graduating on July 8<sup>th</sup> at the Browns Point Fire Station #77. Due to COVID restrictions, only Chiefs and Recruits will be in attendance. The program will be streamed for family.
- All permits for the new Administrative Officers in Eatonville have been issued. The expected start date of construction is July 12<sup>th</sup> with an estimated completion date and relocation in late September. This is also dependent in any changes in the Governor's Proclamations.
- The district continues to update and maintain facilities. The most recent project was the repair and repaint of station #170.

### June 2020 Water Sewer Work List Synopsis

- Daily water and wastewater water quality laboratory testing and system checks.
- Daily Water and wastewater treatment quality assurance / quality control laboratory testing
- Daily pick up garbage in parks
- Daily water and wastewater treatment plant maintenance
- Daily meter reads move in/outs.
- Locates as requested around town
- Fill pot holes around town.
- Mow grass in parks
- Train employees at both water and wastewater plants
- Clean sewer lift stations
- Various afterhours WTP and WWTP alarms
- Install several street signs around town
- Inspect new Water / Sewer connections.
- Clean treatment plants top to bottom.
- Clean, unplug and TV sewer main around town.
- Install several new water meters at new connections
- Help power crew.
- Water leak detection around town.
- Continue annual DOH and Ecology water/wastewater reports.
- Update water cross connection program.
- Work on new construction projects and updates.
- Repair chlorine issues at WTP
- Fix several water leaks around town
- Spray weed killer various locations and R-O-W
- Monitor street projects
