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### **General**

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### **Public Safety Committee**

There was no public safety committee meeting in July.

### ***Management Activities***

I provided my officers with a "360 evaluation" form in which they could rate my performance (in multiple categories) and included a space for any positive feedback or constructive criticism. I informed them this was not a mandatory exercise but was highly encouraged. I also provided them the option of submitting their evaluation form anonymously. All four officers completed, signed, and returned their evaluation. Despite the absence of constructive criticism, it appeared each officer was honest and forthcoming with their evaluation. I was pleased with the feedback and found it to be very useful. I was able to better evaluate what is important to each officer and how their values regarding my leadership, supervision, and mentorship differ.

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**SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE**

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- SPFR had graduated two firefighters from Bates Technical College Fire Academy 20B-87. FF /EMT Terry Akin and FF/PM Alex Roban-Cook. FF Akin is already back on 24 hr. shifts & FF Roban-Cook will continue a 40 hr. a week schedule to finish required training.
- SPFR currently has 4 new Volunteer Firefighters in the Pierce County Joint Volunteer Fire Academy which started on August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020.
- Construction on the new Administrative Offices in Eatonville has begun. The expected completion date and relocation in the first weeks of October. This is also dependent in any changes in the Governor's Proclamations.
- COVID testing was provided on July 31<sup>st</sup> in the City of Roy. I would like to thank Chaplain Dorothy and our support Services staff for assisting.

- Daily water and wastewater water quality laboratory testing and system checks.
- Daily Water and wastewater treatment quality assurance / quality control laboratory testing
- Daily pick up garbage in parks
- Daily water and wastewater treatment plant maintenance
- Daily meter reads move in/outs.
- Locates as requested around town
- Fill pot holes around town.
- Mow grass in parks
- Train employees at both water and wastewater plants
- Clean sewer lift stations
- Various afterhours WTP and WWTP alarms
- Install several street signs around town
- Inspect new Water / Sewer connections.
- Clean treatment plants top to bottom.
- Clean, unplug and TV sewer main around town.
- Install several new water meters at new connections
- Help power crew.
- Water leak detection around town.
- Continue annual DOH and Ecology water/wastewater reports.
- Update water cross connection program.
- Work on new construction projects and updates.
- Repair chlorine issues at WTP
- Fix several water leaks around town
- Spray weed killer various locations and R-O-W
