SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE

- SPFR is proud to announce that all three Firefighter Paramedics have successfully completed their probationary period. FF/PM Canny, O'Driscoll, and Roeun have completed a 13-week recruit school and a full year of training and testing culminating in a day long written and practical exam.
- SPFR currently has 3 new Volunteer Firefighters in two separate Volunteer Fire Academy. These include the Pierce County Joint Volunteer Fire Academy and Buckley Fire Academy.
- Construction on the new Administrative Officers in Eatonville continues. The expected completion date and relocation in the first weeks of October.
- SPFR assisted COVID testing on August 26th in the City of Roy, at the Roy Elementary School.
- The City of Roy provided a Free Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) giveaway.
