## **SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE**

- SPFR has conducted the final probationary test for FF Terry Akin. He is completing his year of training and testing culminating in a day long written and practical exam. Like many of our firefighters, Terry started as a volunteer and has since moved to the career ranks. This is a testament to the successful volunteer program.
- 3 new Volunteer Firefighters continue in two separate Volunteer Fire Academy. These include the Pierce County Joint Volunteer Fire Academy and Buckley Fire Academy.
- Construction on the new Administrative Offices in Eatonville continues. Carpet is going in and we expect to get final occupancy in the next two weeks.
- SPFR continues to assist in COVID testing. Next scheduled date is November 21st in the City of Roy, at the Roy Elementary School.
- SPFR has ordered of a new fire engine that will be received approx. October of 2021.
