OCTOBER 2020 REPORT

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### **General**

As the year 2020 creeps closer to an end, I am optimistic while looking forward to the decline of the COVID-19 epidemic and its encompassing dangers. I am starting my wish list for 2021 and have many projects that I would like to see come to fruition with the absence of social distancing and restrictive operations.

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### **Public Safety Committee**

There was not a public safety meeting in October.

### **Management Activities**

I have revisited my search for ballistic helmets for all EPD Officers. Last year I wrote a grant for 5 helmets which was not awarded due to higher priority and regionally advantageous equipment needs among other agencies. I spoke with the PCSD SWAT commander and inquired if he could assist us. He advised his team was phasing out a majority of their helmets for new ones and offered them to our department. They are lightweight and level IIIA (resistant to .223 rifle caliber). We expect to have them available to us around March of 2021. This equipment would be essential in the event of an active shooter or other serious incident involving firearms.

Officer McGuire, Officer Duran, and I were able to hand out about 3000 pieces of candy during the October 24<sup>th</sup> and October 31<sup>st</sup> Halloween celebrations. We also joined with Shaken of Eatonville to distribute free hotdogs and chips to trick-or-treaters.

At the suggestion of a council member, the statistics category of "code enforcement" will now include activities relating to code violations, to include verbal warnings with voluntary compliance and any assistance to assistance the Town Planning and Building department.

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## **SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE**

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- SPFR is in the process of recruiting another class of volunteer firefighters with the testing to begin in December. The next Volunteer Academy starts in February 2021.
- Construction on the new Administrative Offices is complete. The staff is occupying but the facility is still closed to the general public per regulations until Phase 4.
- SPFR continues to assist in COVID testing. Next scheduled date is November 21st in the City of Roy, at the Roy Elementary School.
- SPFR is discussing a partnership with Tacoma Pierce Health District and the Eatonville Schools for a COVID Testing project. We will be meeting on November 6<sup>th</sup> for further discussion and planning.
- Construction continues the new Brush Rig for the District.
