### General

Although many agencies are seeing (anecdotally) an increase in crime across the board, EPD observes a level trend of crime/activity statistics.

Last week the Washington Supreme Court declared RCW 69.50.4013 unconstitutional.

**Simple Possession of Drugs.** Washington's "strict liability" (meaning with no intent element to be proven) drug possession statute, RCW 69.50.4013, makes possession of a controlled substance a felony exceeds the State's police power and violates the due process clauses of the state and federal constitutions. Unintentional, unknowing possession of a controlled substance is the sort of innocent, passive nonconduct that falls beyond the State's police power to criminalize. The affirmative defense of "unwitting possession," is insufficient to save Washington's strict liability drug possession statute. The statute cannot be saved by a judicially added mens rea (intent) element. *State v. Blake*, No. 96873-0 (Feb. 25, 2021). Justices Stephens, concurred in part and dissented in part. She would have added an implied mens rea. Justices Johnson, Madsen, and Owens dissented.

This will change the way we respond and react to drug possession cases until the legislature can implement permanent changes to the statute.

### Management Activities

I am continuing my research on the implementation and the issuing of ballistic helmets for our officers. PCSD SWAT is still offering to provide "used" helmets in the coming month.

We are still moving forward with the mobile fingerprint identification beta program. The vendor is working with our I.T. department to ensure compatibility and security of the systems. Part of this compatibility includes dual-authentication software which is a prerequisite to installing fingerprint identification software. Dual

authentication is also now a federal requirement for all government agencies as it relates to the security of data and data devices.

I am continuing research on license plate readers for at least 2 of our patrol vehicles. The Pierce County Sheriff's Department is also researching this technology and I will parallel their efforts.
