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### *Community Support*

- All Town residents can now apply for and receive their State of Washington Concealed Pistol License or Pistol Transfers through the Eatonville Police Department. If interested, contact Gaille at the Police Department on Tuesdays and Wednesdays between 9:00 am and 4:00 pm. ### **Public Safety Committee Requests**

A citizen came to my office with concerns about pedestrian safety around the intersection of Center and Mashell after she was bumped by a car that crept into a crosswalk. Councilman Dunn suggested the use of crossing flags. I think these flags would serve a dual purpose in alerting motorists to pedestrians and getting more pedestrians to use the crosswalks.

### **Recent Events**

I would like to mention that there were very few traffic related issues associated with last week's snow fall. Thanks Eatonville for slowing down and driving carefully.

### **Training**

All mandatory training was completed in 2016. The 2017 training (to include defensive tactics, first aid, active shooter, emergency vehicle operations, and legal updates) are scheduled for the first half of 2017. Summer and winter Firearms have also been scheduled.

I will be attending a 40 hour command college course in early March.

Officer Gill is continuing his training at the State Academy.

### **Management Activities**

- Officer McGuire has been working hard on our transition to the Lexipol Policy manual. This policy manual will be updated automatically as case law changes. The Lexipol Company will keep the

department abreast of these requirements and recommend changes when necessary. This process will ensure that our department is meeting local, state, and federal standards. This initial manual may take several months to complete. I will update the mayor and council when the policy manual is completed.

- The 2017 Training Schedule is finalized and several of us have already attended 2017 mandatory classes.
- Review of Town Codes and enforcement procedures is ongoing.
- We are assisting the School District with their campus security assessments.
- Our third Safe Streets meeting was held on 2/7 with only a few in attendance. We spoke about issues ranging from telephone and internet frauds that are currently in fashion to traffic and pedestrian safety. I will attempt to get a newsletter of sorts out to those that have attended past meetings in an attempt to get the word out about the group.
- In light of the recent snow event, we have been coordinating with Pierce County Department of Emergency Management for resupply of sand and sand bags in the event that a rapid snow melt causes localized flooding issues. Thanks to Steve Mckasson for thinking ahead.

### **Significant cases**

I would like to remind Eatonville residents to report suspicious or illegal activity to the Police Department before posting it on a social media site. There were two incidents in January that come to mind;

One is a car prowler that prowled several cars on Antonie Ave. One victim reported the theft of a few dollars and a rather unique flashlight. Other victim(s) had actually seen the suspect in their vehicle but did not call police immediately. Be assured that the Eatonville Police Department will arrest and book any car prowlers regardless of the amount of theft or damage to a vehicle.

The second issue that was brought to my attention was a commercial vehicle that was passing cars in an unsafe manner and possibly even driving on the sidewalk at one point. People were outraged on the social media site but I only learned of it when a citizen came to my office much later. Please report driving such as this to 9-1-1 immediately. I would like to follow up on this case. I would like anyone who witnessed a blue logging truck being driven recklessly last week on center street in front of Arrow Lumber to please contact the police department and complete a handwritten statement. I will personally follow up on this case.






